Plaintiff Greg Gamache, 1816 Fairgrounds Road, St. Charles, Missouri , 63303, has filed a *pro se* Complaint against the Federal Bureau of Investigations (“FBI”) and the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”). Gamache alleges that the FBI and the FCC refuse to investigate complaints of unidentified government officials using electronic weapons to harm and kill “whistleblowers, undesirables, or persons of interest.” R. 2, p. 2. Broadly construed, Gamache’s claims fall under 28 U.S.C. § 1331 and the doctrine announced in *Bivens v. Six Unknown Federal Narcotics Agents*, 403 U.S. 388 (1971).¹

Gamache has filed a handwritten motion to proceed *in forma pauperis*, R. 3, but because non-prisoner plaintiffs seeking pauper status must submit the four-page E.D. Ky. Form 519, his current motion to proceed *in forma pauperis* will be denied without prejudice. Gamche must pay the \$350.00 filing fee, or if he wishes to proceed *in forma pauperis*, he must complete and file

¹ Gamache seeks an Order directing both agencies to co-investigate complaints of electronic weapons; to direct the FBI to establish a phone number exclusively for victims of electronic weapons to use, and to not require “proof” of an attack; and to direct the FCC to dispatch employees to the site of reported incidents and detect the source of the frequencies, *i.e.*, the electronic weapons. *Id.*

the attached E.D. Ky. 519 Form within twenty (20) days of the date of entry of this Order.

THE COURT ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

(1) Plaintiff Greg Gamache's motion to proceed *in forma pauperis*,” R. 3, is

DENIED WITHOUT PREJUDICE;

(2) The Clerk of the Court shall mark the assigned case number on the accompanying E. D. Ky. Form 519 and send it to Gamache;

(3) Within twenty (20) days of the date of entry of this Order, Gamache must either pay the \$350.00 filing fee or fully complete and file the E. D. Ky. Form 519;

(4) If Gamache either fails to submit E. D. Ky. Form 519 or pay the filing fee within twenty days of the date of entry of this Order, the Court will presume that he is not a pauper and order the case dismissed for want of prosecution. If the case is dismissed under these circumstances, it will not be reinstated to the active docket even if Gamache subsequently pays the filing fee. *McGore v. Wrigglesworth*, 114 F.3d 601, 605 (6th Cir. 1997); and

(5) The Clerk of the Court is directed to submit the record upon either: (a) payment of the \$350.00 filing fee or the filing of the E. D. Ky. Form 519, or (b) expiration of twenty-five (25) days from the date of entry of this Order, whichever shall occur first.
